**Neighborhood Demographics**

Information was distributed that had neighborhood demographics for West Central. It was noted that these were taken from the 2000 census so the data could be a little off. The demographics had comparisons for the City of Springfield and the Urban Neighborhoods Alliance footprint. The median income for WC is \$16,854 and there are 3212 housing units in the neighborhood. This is a little skewed by the fact of the number of multi-family units in the neighborhood, including high rise apartment complexes. Of those housing units, 22.7% are owner-occupied and 77.3% are renter-occupied. *NOTE: Data was later compiled to show that currently there are 1335 single family households and of those, 516 or 38.7% are owner occupied.* Other statistics included:

- 49% of the household fall below 50% of the median income
- 22% of the households have income greater than 100% of the median income
- The average year the homes were built in West Central is 1959
- 20.3% of refinanced mortgages were done by subprime lenders
- The median sales price for a single-family home in West Central is \$45,500
- 24.8% of residents have no high school degree while 8.1% of the residents have a bachelor's degree or higher
- Breakdown for employment includes 12.5% in management, 30.9% in service, 28.2% in sales, 7.5% in construction and 20.9% in production

**Past Neighborhood Plans**

Randall Whitman, City of Springfield, spoke of the two plans that have been completed by the City of Springfield—*1998 West Central Strategic Plan* and *2003 Central Springfield Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy*. Both plans may be helpful in providing a historical context to what West Central wants to accomplish and to also show what has been done in the neighborhood. Copies of those are available through the Urban Neighborhoods Alliance or the Neighborhood Conservation Office at the City of Springfield. The current *West Central Neighborhood Stabilization Program* will allow for some more pro-active addressing of neighborhood issues.

**Campbell Elementary School**

Dr. Jason Anderson spoke about Campbell Elementary and the challenges they face as a school. Probably the biggest challenge is the 94.7% figure for free and reduced lunches. Jason shared that the dedication of the staff is remarkable and most are long-term teachers at Campbell. The mobility rate at Campbell is 97% which

indicated the amount of turnover of students at the school. Campbell has a fairly diverse mix of students and Anderson feels that their proximity to downtown will eventually be a recruiting tool for the school. It was also noted that Anderson received Missouri's 2009 Distinguished Principal by the Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals.

### **McGregor Elementary School**

Although Jeff Thornsberry, principal at McGregor Elementary was unable to attend the meeting, Brian Hubbard Title 1 Director with the district and former principal at McGregor was able to address the group. McGregor is another very diverse school with almost 40% minority students. McGregor is an English as a Second Language (ESL) school for the district but this may change for the future because of that program being revamped.

### **Caring Communities**

Lisa Taylor, Community Development Specialist, talked about what Caring Communities does for West Central in relation to Community Partnership's mission. Caring Communities fosters powerful partnerships that work to address seven core results:

- Parents working
- Children and families safe
- Young children ready to enter school
- Children succeeding in school
- Children and families healthy
- Youth ready to enter productive adulthood
- Strong thriving neighborhoods

She shared with the group the many programs that Caring Communities offers to the neighborhoods through the schools, including CASH classes, free tax clinics, after school clubs, crisis prevention, adult GED, Lead & Learn, and Missouri re-entry assistance.

### **What's Working & What's Not Working?**

Participants identified things in the neighborhood that they feel are working and are not working. Those include the following:

#### *What's Working—*

- Police presence
- Attraction of college students & professors of higher education
- Neighborhood schools
- Neighborhood association
- Clean-up of graffiti
- Diversity in neighborhood make-up

#### *What's Not Working—*

- Perception of neighborhood
- 65-70% of the calls for service in officer's beat is in West Central
- Drug dealing
- Disregard for laws already in place
- Panhandlers
- Slumlords

- Civil criminal justice system
- LOUD music
- Trash
- Unleashed dogs
- Repeat offenders
- Lack of knowledge on available resources and programs
- Recruitment of residents with greater discretionary income
- Complaint-based reporting system of violators

These will be looked at and strategies/goals/objectives will be determined to address those that can be. The next meeting is planned for Tuesday, July 21 at McGregor School. Possible presenters include:

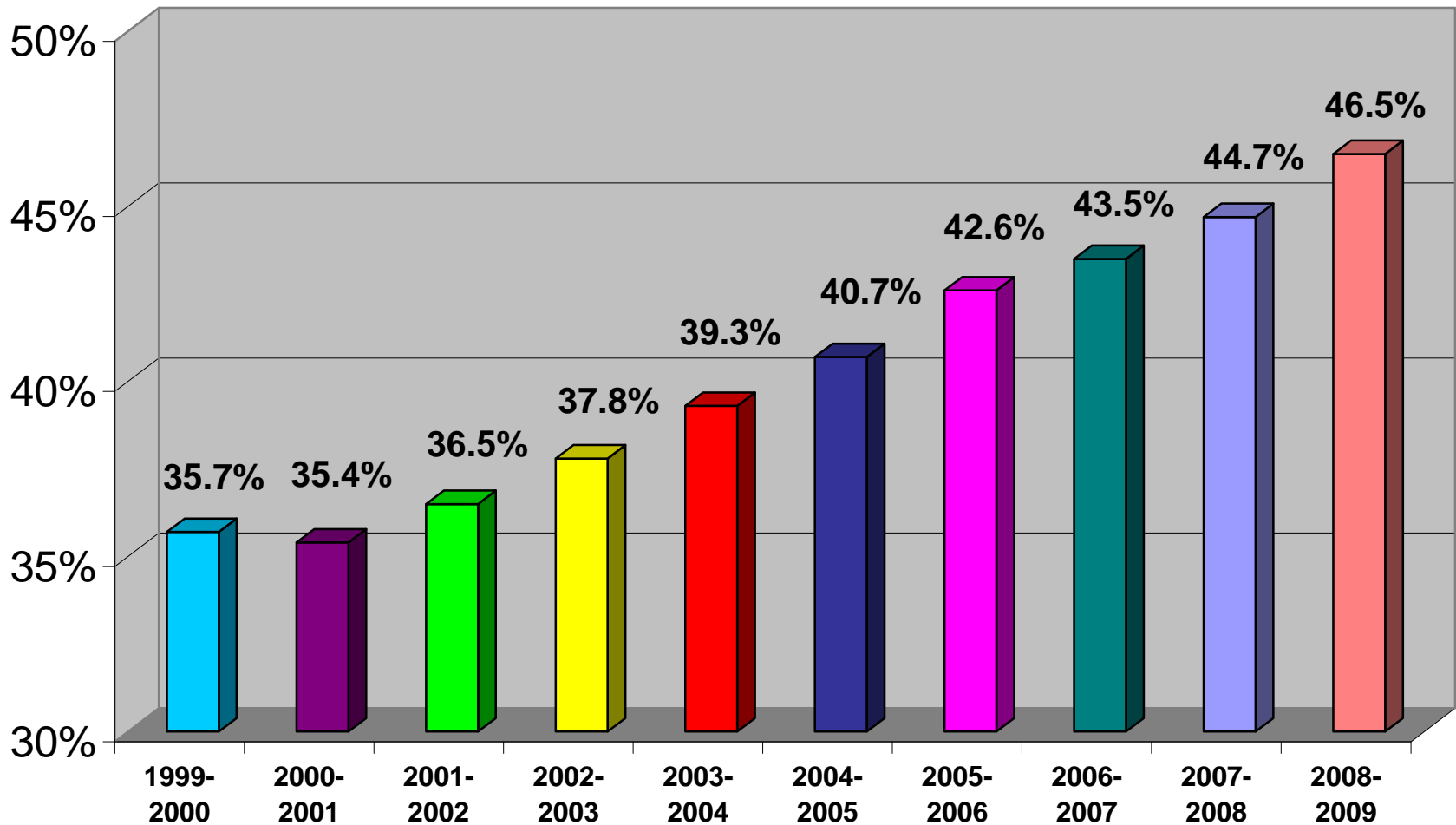
